ongressman Mark Amodei has served the 2nd Congressional District of Nevada since 2011. He was born in June 1958 and raised in Carson City, Nevada. Mark served in the U.S. Army in the JAG Corp after passing the bar.

Congressman Amodei introduced 45 bills into Congress among which are: HR4688 Douglas County Economics Development and Conservation Act of 2016, which directed the Forest Service to convey approximately 67 acres of certain Forest Service land (Lake Tahoe-Nevada State Park) to the state of Nevada, and HR2324 Small Lands Tract Conveyance Act to accelerate the process for transferring small parcels of federal land to the local communities.

Congressman Amodei served on the following committees: House Committee of Appropriations, House Judiciary Committee, House Natural Resources Committee, and House Committee of Veterans Affairs.

Congressman Amodei did not join the majority of Republican members of Congress who sided with Trump's attempt to overturn the 2020 Presidential elections.










Nevada Caucus Process



Chairman McDonald and Jim DeGraffenreid, National Committeeman, from the Nevada Republican Party were our guest speakers in October. They provided us with a thorough explanation of why the Republican Party is holding a caucus, and what the differences are between a caucus and primary. The Nevada Republican Party is looking forward to hosting the **First In The West Caucus on Thursday**, **February 8, 2024**. The Caucus will occur at 5 PM, and be hosted in meetings assigned by precinct locations statewide.

You must be a registered Republican to participate, and government-issued ID is required in order to verify your identity. Voting takes place on paper ballots with tabulation all caucus-goers can observe. A caucus is the best way for voters to play an essential role in electing our next President of the United States. Our caucus has many of the common-sense election reforms supported by Governor Lombardo:

- Voter ID required
- No mass-mailed ballots
- Precinct-based voting
- Limited to registered Republicans
- Election day, not election month!

we will begin the task of re-forming the County Party for the next two years. It all starts with the



Precinct Meetings held simultaneously with the Presidential Caucus on Thursday, February 8th. This will be the time to recommend ideas for the 2024-2026 Platform, Bylaws, and Resolutions. These will be submitted to the various Committees to be proposed at the County Convention in March. At this time you may sign up to be a delegate for the County Convention.

At the County Convention we finalize the Platform, Bylaws, and Resolutions. All Central Committee members will have to re-apply and be voted in to be members. This is also the time delegates will be elected to the State Convention scheduled in May.

At the State Convention we will do much the same as the County. We will break up into Committees to work on a proposed State Platform, Bylaws, and Resolutions. Also delegates will be elected to represent Nevada at the National Convention in Milwaukee, July 15-18, 2024.

This cycle repeats every even numbered year. It begins at the local precinct meetings (essentially our neighbors), followed by the County Convention, then the State Convention, and finally the National Convention.

In Milwaukee, we will crown our nominees for President and Vice President and develop a National Platform. It all starts with our neighborhood precincts. Precincts are the building blocks of our party.

The Douglas County Republican Central Committee meets the 2nd Thursday of every month at The Elks Lodge on Kimmerling in Gardnerville. Doors open at 6:30 p.m. and the meeting starts at 7:00 p.m.

All Republicans are welcome. I hope to see you there.
